After much anticipation the 13th ICPS International Conference was held at the Himeji Citizens Hall in Himeji City, Japan, in May 2023. Over 110 attendees from around the world participated! The Japanese Carnivorous Plant Society (JCPS) with the cooperation of the Kansai Carnivorous Plant Society (KCPS), the Tokai Carnivorous Plant Society (TCPS), and the Hiroshima Carnivorous Plant Society (HCPS) did a fantastic job hosting. The hospitality suite which consisted of refreshments ranging from tea, coffee, non-alcoholic sake, and a multitude of Japanese style snacks were sampled and enjoyed between the 18 presentations.

Almost everyone participated in the first night's banquet at Hotel Monterey Himeji. There, we were able to see the beautiful Himeji Castle light up at night. The first day's field trips included Tegarayama Conservatory Botanical Garden and Hyogo Prefectural Flower Center. On the second day, participants visited Hyogo Prefecture (Abiki Marsh and Nishiwaki City) by a minibus and spotted wild populations of *Drosera lunata*, *D. tokaiensis*, and *D. rotundifolia* as well as a *Utricularia* species.

The last day consisted of 20 conference participants seeing wild *Pinguicula ramosa* blooming in Nikko.
