CARNIVORES IN THE CLASSROOM GRANTS 2025

For the 4th year in a row the ICPS will host Carnivores in the Classroom teacher grants. We want to spread the joy and wonder of carnivorous plants to younger generations. The grant period is open 1-31 August 2025. Grant recipients will be notified mid-September and teachers will receive live carnivorous plants worth \$150 shipped to their classrooms. To be eligible for this grant, applicants must be or become a member of the International Carnivorous Plant Society and teach kindergarten through 12th grade in a public or private school. Teachers are welcome to submit their lesson first and after knowing they have been awarded the grant, then pay for the ICPS membership.
