- Conservation of endangered *Sarracenia* habitat in the United States
- Carnivores in the Classroom, a multinational program promoting carnivorous plant education
- The study of *Drosera* species in Africa
- *Nepenthes* research in Malaysia
- Graduate student projects focused on carnivorous plant species

These endeavors have resulted in the preservation of critical sites, descriptions of new species, and a greater understanding of carnivorous plants across the globe.

The ICPS is honored to represent plants and people located on all habitable continents. Reduced focus on conservation and increased habitat degradation affects us all. **We need your help to continue funding our largest conservation project in 2026.**

The ICPS has partnered with Auburn University for the past several years to preserve *Sarracenia oreophila* habitat in the southeast United States. Volunteer conservationists work with arborists, U.S. Fish & Wildlife officials, wildland firefighters, and private landowners to clear encroaching vegetation and ensure the continual survival of *S. oreophila* and other endangered plants. To the delight of all involved, this project has been massively successful and has expanded from the initial site to multiple areas of formal management. The 2026 goal for the ICPS support of this project is \$11,000 USD. Can you help?
